Finding Voice William B. Kincaid,2012-11-30 In Finding Voice Kincaid employs an often used but somewhat elusive metaphor voice as a way of speaking of pastoral identity and contends that a lively imaginative pastoral voice emerges from a thorough grasp of context theology pastoral roles personal journey and systemic dynamics Designed as a text for the field education contextual education and supervised ministry experiences of seminary students and others preparing for congregational leadership Finding Voice examines in depth how people are experiencing each of these constituent parts of pastoral voice at their student ministry sites not only to learn about each of the areas but also to recognize and understand what is being called forth in the students as they engage these five key experiences and begin to visualize their future ministry The book further explores the opportunities created when the five aspects of pastoral identity are in conflict with one another In the absence of any one of these or the imbalance of them pastoral voice gets skewed and vibrant effective ministry is undermined Finding Voice urges students to begin now with field education to engage a practice of ministry that is imaginative courageous nimble and faithful

Identity and Justice Debbie Rodan, 2004 Debbie Rodan adds breadth and depth to the field of literary cultural and gender studies through a meticulous investigation of notions such as representation justice and legitimation She examines their historical and philosophical trajectories as well as their politico juridical underpinnings through an ambitious and timely recuperation of the Enlightenment projects of rationality and emancipation The point of departure is a critical engagement with the theoretical work of John Rawls Jürgen Habermas and Jean-François Lyotard Rodan claims each can be read as foregrounding diverse ways of constituting identity within the social world Recognition of other people's identity at the social cultural and national level is crucial to the possibility of justice Rodan tests the concepts of justice legitimation and identity through detailed critical readings analyses of a range of texts The range includes the film *East is East* a number of autobiographical narratives as well as the Australian government report *Bringing Them Home* which is concerned with the removal of Aboriginal children from their families She avoids polarising Aboriginal non-Aboriginal notions of justice identity etc by including texts which raise and problematise questions of ethnicity and gender

Recognized Women: Carolina Esser, 2025-01-29 Axel Honneth's theory of recognition comes from a theoretical paradigm attached to Western deliberative democracy Honneth does not interpret recognition from the perspective of gender equality and how a woman may be

recognized in non democratic and non Western societies If one interprets the theory of recognition with a focus on the situation of women it is possible to identify that legal recognition plays a fundamental role It is relevant then to propose forms of struggling for the recognition of these women It is adopted the methodology of Critical Theory and recognition is illustrated from the perspectives of case studies for instance regarding women in China and Morocco In these countries there are different forms of disrespect Nevertheless despite restrictions imposed by government and culture both countries still have forms of struggling for recognition that should be perceived Several forms of struggling for recognition to turn recognition into a universal institute which can be applied in different contexts There are always forms of struggling for better conditions of women s recognition in every community through the support of law
