Present Progressive	That car <b>is not coming</b> here.
Simple Past	We <b>watched</b> the news last night.
Past Progressive	Mark <b>wasn't lying</b> when he said he loved you.
Present Perfect	You <b>have</b> already <b>eaten</b> four plums.
Present Perfect Progressive	The athlete <b>has been running</b> for a trophy.
Past Perfect	I went there after I <b>had completed</b> the task.
Past Perfect Progressive	He <b>had not been reading</b> a book.
Future – will	You <b>will</b> not marry me.
Future – going to	We're <b>going to</b> be crazy.
Future Progressive	I <b>will not be waiting</b> for you.
Future Perfect	They <b>won't have been married</b> by next year.
Future Perfect Progressive	I <b>will not have been shopping</b> on Tuesday.
