Petrilli, 2001 **Contemporary French Cinema** Guy Austin, 1996-11-15 Examines popular French film of the last 25 years Charts recent developments in all genres since the New Wave including the heritage film the thriller the war film cinema du look Other topics include representations of sexuality the work of women film makers Includes a filmography *Reading in Proust's A la recherche* Adam Watt, 2009-06-18 Through close textual analysis of the scenes of reading in Proust's *A la recherche du temps perdu* Adam Watt offers an invigorating new study of the novel and previously unacknowledged paths through it After considering key childhood Primal Scenes which mark the act of reading as revelatory and potentially traumatic the book then identifies and examines the interwoven strands of the novel's narrative of reading showing that scenes where the narrator reads and where others provide lessons in reading are intricately connected within the narrator's ever unfolding considerations of intelligence sense experience knowledge and desire These acts of reading often bewildering the narrator with their mix of illuminations wrong turns and over determinations lead us to interrogate our own understanding of the act we accomplish as we read *A la recherche* This book emphasizes the complexities and contradictions with which reading always inescapably an engagement of both mind and body is riven and which connect it repeatedly to the experience of involuntary memory Reading is shown to be frequently fraught with heady instability and lire of a highly revealing sort from which narrator and readers alike have much to learn The book's final chapter shows how the narrator's critical energies turned contemplatively inwards in the Guermantes library are subsequently turned outwards for a final interpretive effort the reading of his now aged acquaintances at the Bal de t tes in a shift that provides the narrator not only the confidence to begin his work of art but also the humility to face undeterred the approach of death

The Mother in/and French Literature, 2021-11-22 The essays in this volume investigate maternity and the figure of the mother in French literature from France Switzerland Quebec and Africa from the seventeenth century to the present Drawing on cultural history psychoanalysis and feminist theory as well as more traditional methods they present maternity as a source of frustration and of joy mothers as repressed and revered daughters as wounded and loving sons as domineering and dependent Indeed few things are simple where mothers and especially where writing about mothers are concerned

*This "Self" Which Is Not One* Natalie Edwards, Christopher Hogarth, 2010-03-08 The Self Which is Not One Women s Life Writing in French assembles articles on women s life writing from diverse areas of the Francophone world It is comprised of nine chapters that discuss female writers from North Africa Sub Saharan Africa the Caribbean and Europe in addition to French writers The idea of the self is currently attracting widespread interest in academia most notably in the arts and humanities The development of postmodernism supposes a fragmented subject formed from the network of available discourses rather than a stable and coherent self Jacques Derrida for example wrote that there is no longer any such things

as a full subject and Julia Kristeva now insists that the individual is a subject in process. The growing importance of psychoanalytic theory, particular in French studies, has also impacted upon this development. The basic tenet of psychoanalytic theory is that the individual is formed of a duality, the conscious and unconscious parts of the self, which prevent the individual from ever fully knowing her/himself and which thus insists upon a plural, incomplete self. Developments in the field of postcolonial studies have also made us aware of different ways of approaching the self in different parts of the world and eroded the idea of a stable, conscious and complete self. As scholars examine these new ways of approaching the self, autobiography has been the subject of renewed interest. Several academic books have appeared in recent years that study the ways in which autobiographers represent the self as incomplete, evolving and elusive. In particular, a number of books have appeared on the subject of women's autobiography and female subjectivity, such as works by Sidonie Smith, Julia Watson and Nancy Miller, and several volumes interrogate postcolonial women's autobiography, such as texts by Françoise Lionnet, Gayatri Spivak, Carole Boyce Davies and Chandra Mohanty. Our volume unites these strands of criticism by examining ways that female autobiographies write the self as a fragmented, plural construct across the Francophone world. This will be the first book-length study of this important development.
