- Both logic and ontology are important areas of philosophy covering large, diverse, and active research projects.
- These two areas overlap from time to time and problems or questions arise that concern both.
- In this lecture we intend to discuss some of these areas of overlap.
 - In particular, there is no single philosophical problem of the intersection of logic and ontology.
 - •This is partly so because the philosophical disciplines of logic and of ontology are themselves quite diverse and there is thus the possibility of many points of intersection.
 - In the following we will first distinguish different philosophical projects that are covered under the terms 'logic' and 'ontology'.
 - We will then discuss a selection of problems that arise in the different areas of contact
