- Pencils

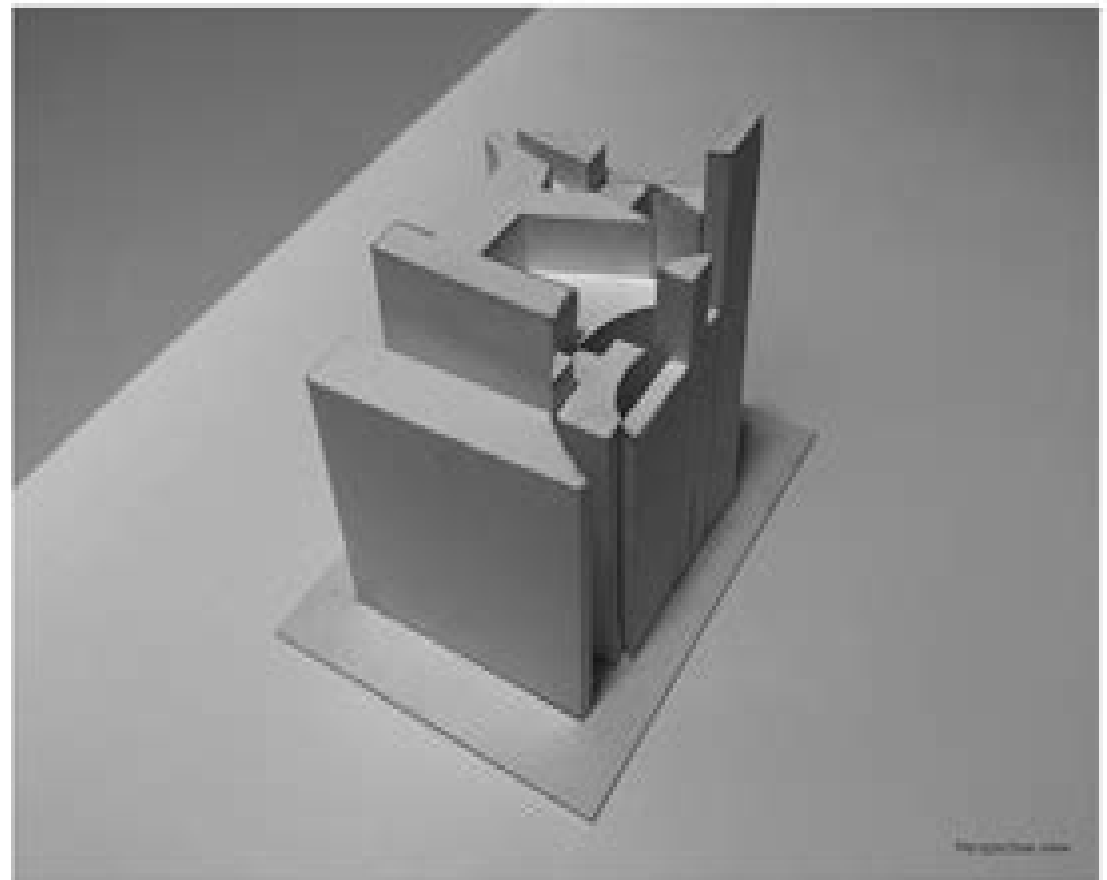
Working Process
