

Expository Essay Structure

Introduction	Introduce the essay with a hook that demonstrates relevance of the essay to the reader. Introduce the topic and outline your essay structure
	Thesis Statement: Don't forget to state your thesis statement in the introduction. For an expository essay, it should be a statement of fact not an argument.
Body Paragraphs	<p>Each body paragraph should contribute one new key idea that adds depth to your explanations of the overarching topic, helping readers to develop a deeper understanding on the topic. Typical body paragraph structure is as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Topic sentence: Introduce what topic or point the paragraph will cover. The paragraph should only address one key point and not go off-topic.• Elaboration: Elaborate on the topic sentence by adding detail and information about this argument.• Support: Include a fact, quote, or important piece of information about the topic that demonstrates you have conducted research into the topic.• Summary: Add one sentence that will summarize this paragraph topic and link it back to the overall thesis statement.• Transition: Transition to the next paragraph.
Conclusion	Close the loop by returning to a statement you made in the introduction. Show what your final position is. Explain who should be interested in your findings. End by noting in one final, engaging sentence why this topic is of such importance.
