

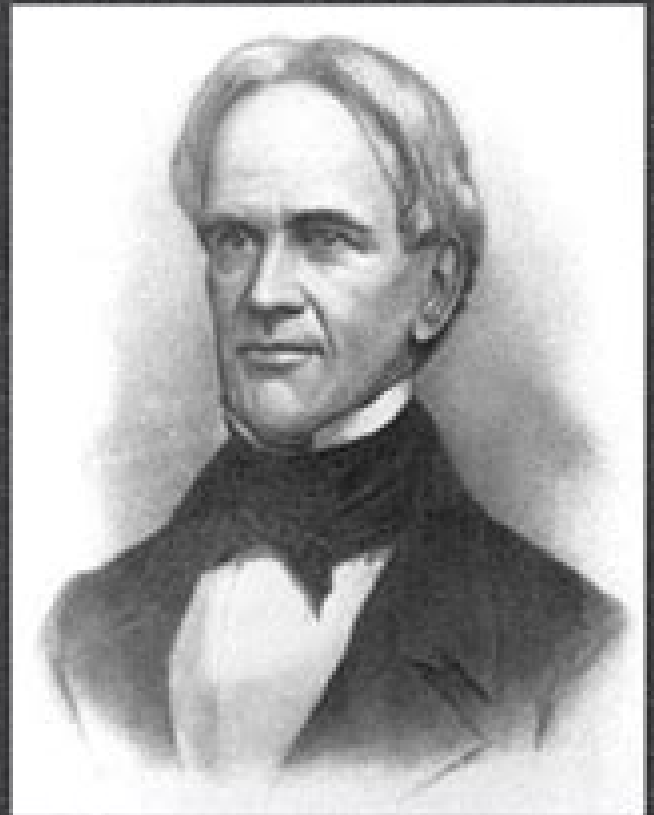
How Was Education Reformed?
