If schools are to become laboratories of democracy and entrepreneurship and if students are to become engaged as partners in renewal of their communities, a research case must be made for service learning. Does learning take place? Will other kinds of learning suffer? What kinds of practice are most effective? Clearly, solid research is essential if this transforming way of teaching and learning is to be fully integrated into American schooling and youth development institutions.
