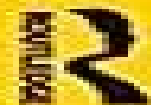

called information. The merging of general systems theory and information communication theory produced powerful new technologies that imitate some inborn human capabilities like self-direction e.g. control systems, computers, internet. But those technologies do not have the key process that makes a unit a living system. They do not have self-constructing capabilities i.e. they cannot create life. That is why humans as living systems are so creative and flexibly adaptive. This theoretical model has been applied to understanding and helping people deal with their problems and possibilities in their lives e.g. developmental psychology, counseling and psychotherapy, motivation, child development, vocational and career development, Alzheimer's.
