Manual of Catalan Linguistics Joan A. Argenter, Jens Lüdtke, 2020-04-06 This manual is intended to fill a gap in the area of Romance studies There is no introduction available so far that broadly covers the field of Catalan linguistics neither in Catalan nor in any other language The work deals with the language spoken in Catalonia and Andorra the Balearic Islands the region of Valencia Northern Catalonia and the town of l'Alguer in Sardinia Besides introducing the ideologies of language and nation and the history of Catalan linguistics the manual is divided into separate parts embracing the description grammar lexicon variation and varieties and the history of the language since the early medieval period to the present day It also covers its current social and political situation in the new local and global contexts The main emphasis is placed on modern Catalan The manual is designed as a companion for students of Catalan while also introducing specialists of other languages into this field in particular scholars of Romance languages

Bilingual Legacies Anna Casas Aguilar, 2022-05-30 Bilingual Legacies examines fatherhood in the work of four canonical Spanish authors born in Barcelona and raised during the dictatorship of Francisco Franco Drawing on the autobiographical texts of Juan Goytisolo Carlos Barral Terenci Moix and Clara Janés the book explores how these authors understood gender roles and paternal figures as well as how they positioned themselves in relation to Spanish and Catalan literary traditions Anna Casas Aguilar contends that through their presentation of father figures these authors subvert static ideas surrounding fatherhood She argues that this diversity was crucial in opening the door to revised gender models in Spain during the democratic period Moving beyond the shadow of the dictator Casas Aguilar shows how these writers distinguished between the patriarchal father of the nation and their own paternal figures In doing so Bilingual Legacies sheds light on the complexity of Spanish conceptions of gender language and family and illustrates how notions of masculinity authorship and canon are interrelated

contends that the Plantagenet kings of England mockingly ascribed a literal understanding of the myth of King Arthur's return to the Brittonic Celts whilst adopting for themselves a figurative and typological interpretation of the myth. A central figure in this work is Arthur of Brittany 1187-1203 who for more than a generation was the focus of Arthurian hopes and their disappointment. Catalonia Since the Spanish Civil War Andrew Dowling, 2013. This book examines the transformation of the Catalan nation in socio-economic, political and historical terms and offers an innovative interpretation of the determinants of its nationalist mobilisation. With Franco's and Spanish nationalism's victory in 1939 and the consolidation of a long-lasting dictatorship, it appeared certain that the Catalan national movement would be crushed. Yet this did not happen and Catalan nationalism and identity re-emerged at the end of Franco's dictatorship in 1975 more firmly rooted than before. The core of this book traces the Francoist repression and the nationalist response to it, demonstrating how new political actors reconfigured Catalan nationalism over the course of the Franco regime 1939-1975. Post-Franco Catalan cultural and political identity was consolidated and Catalonia became the most successful stateless nationalism in western Europe. The 21st century has been marked by an ever-growing independence movement culminating in the vast demonstration in the city of Barcelona in July 2010. Andrew Dowling provides multi-faceted viewpoints in historic perspective and reflects on possible steps and outcomes for this new pro-independence turn in Catalan nationalism. This study will appeal not only to students of Spain but also to those interested in nationalism as a separate issue of enquiry.
