<p><b>ONE</b></p> <p><u>LEARNING OBJECTIVE</u> To identify and explore some basic dance <u>skills</u></p> <p><u>KEY WORDS</u> Style Movement</p>	<p>a) Introduce LO. The whole class sits in a circle and discuss 'Why is Dance important? What is it for?' Introduce levels, complete assessment sheet. <b>10 mins.</b></p> <p>b) Pupils work in small groups to brainstorm as many different types of <u>dance</u> as they can and examples of where they might see them. <b>5mins.</b></p> <p>c) Circle warm up. The class stand in a circle, the teacher initially leads the <u>warm up</u> and the class copy (e.g. hamstring lifts, star jumps etc) Ask confident pupils if they would like to take over. <b>5 mins.</b></p> <p>d) 'Corner work'. The class gather in the corner of the room and take turns to carry out one movement travelling across the room as demonstrated by the teacher (e.g. step leap, turns, step ball change.) <b>5 mins.</b></p> <p>e) Develop the corner work so a series of movements are used to travel back (e.g. step leap going into step turn followed by step ball change) <b>5mins.</b></p> <p>f) Play a piece of music (teacher can choose) ask pupils to get into small groups (max 5) and choreograph a short routine (approx 30s) The routine can be the style of the pupils choosing and will provide an opportunity to assess pupil's ability. <b>10 mins.</b></p> <p>g) Spotlight pupils to perform their routine for the class, others will evaluate using 'Two Stars and a Wish' Followed by a whole class 'cool down'. <b>5 mins.</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Listening skills</li><li>• Classroom expectations</li><li>• Group <u>work</u></li><li>• Experiment body movement and dance style.</li><li>• Visual memory to retain <u>information</u></li><li>• Pupils reflect on contribution to lesson through informal self-evaluation and peer-evaluation.</li></ul>	<p>N/A</p>
