Using this modeling system, she designed her fiction as a visual-verbal field consisting of still and moving images generated in the imagination located in the brains and central nervous systems of her narrators, characters, and readers, and primarily of the author herself. The author discusses the significations of: 1. Frame's image signs in water, glass, photographs, film, membranes, skin, and clothing; 2. her primary sign repertoire of objects, language, and human persons in the figures of blood, skin, and sun; 3. her body signs including those generated in the circulatory and neurological systems of all human organisms as biosemiotic living systems.
