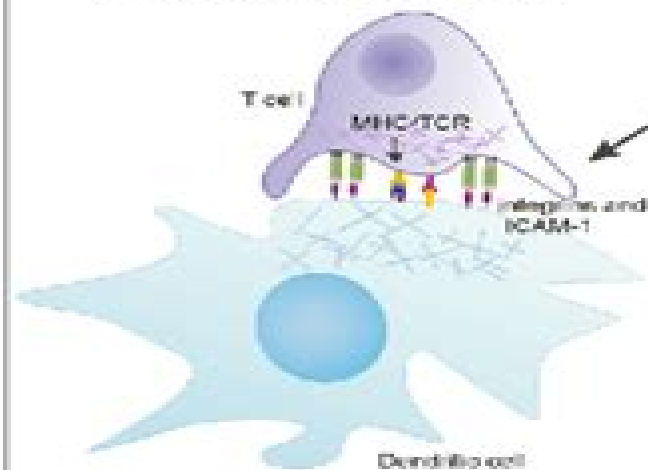

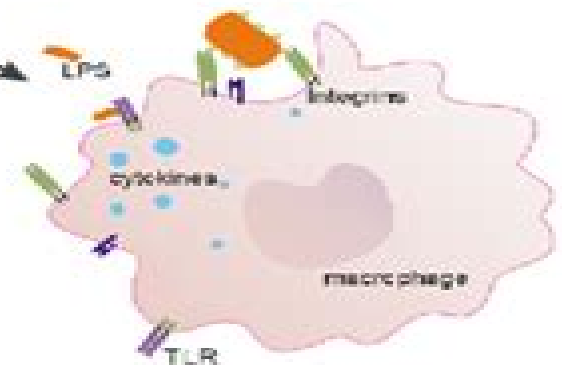

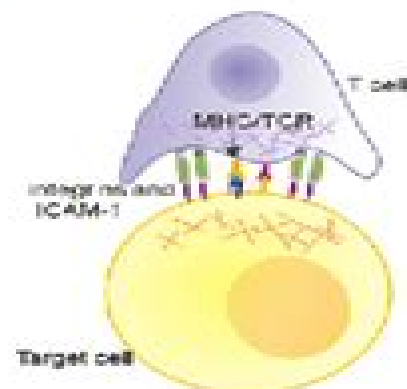

Leukocyte Integrins in the Immune System and Malignant Disease Bernhard Holzmann, Hermann Wagner, 2012-12-06  
Most lymphocytes recirculate throughout the body migrating from blood through organized lymphoid tissues such as lymph nodes LN and Peyer's patches PP then to lymph and back to blood GOWANS and KNIGHT 1964 Smaller numbers of lymphocytes migrate from blood to extranodal tissues such as pancreas and then through lymphatic vessels to LN MACKAY et al 1990 An important feature of this migration is the ability of lymphocytes to recognize and adhere to the surface of blood vessel endothelial cells before migrating through the vessel wall into surrounding tissue CARLOS and HARLAN 1994 IMHOF and DUNON 1995 BUTCHER and PICKER 1996 Adhesion interactions of vascular endothelium with lymphocytes under flow or shear consist of at least four steps 1 an initial transient sticking or rolling 2 if the lymphocytes encounter appropriate activating or chemotactic factors in the local environment rolling may be followed by a lymphocyte activation step that then leads to 3 strong adhesion or sticking that may be followed by 4 lymphocyte diapedesis into tissue BUTCHER 1991 SHIMUZU et al 1992 SPRINGER 1994 BARGATZE et al 1995 Specific lymphocyte and endothelial adhesion molecules AM are involved in each step of this adhesion cascade reviewed in CARLOS and HARLAN 1994 IMHOF and DUNON 1995 BUTCHER and PICKER 1996 This allows lymphocyte migration to be controlled at several different steps leading to a combinatorial increase in specificity and sensitivity *Leukocyte Integrins* Angel L. Evans,C. Haslett,2013-11-11 Great progress has been made since the first description of the acute respiratory distress syndrome by the Denver group in 1967 Lancet Although we introduced the term

adult respiratory distress syndrome in our second and more detailed description of the syndrome ehest 1971 this was probably am mistake for the simple reason that children also suffer the same syndrome fo11owing acute lung insults Today the syndrome of acute respiratory distress in adults ARDS is recognized as a worldwide problem but the prevalence of disease varies in different parts of the world A huge amount of research has focused on the mechanisms of acute lung injury and yet the exact sequence of events and media tors in inflammatory cascade which result in acute respiratory failure from ARDS is not known but many possibilities exist The definition of ARDS has been gradually modified in recent years and investigators around the world are now co11aborating in order to establish more uniform concepts in identification risk factors and mechanisms of lung injury which someday will result in improved approaches to management Already at least some centers are showing improved outcomes in ARDS achieving an approximate 60% survival rate In the past most large series documented only about a 40% survivability taking a11 causes of ARDS This apparent progress is likely attributable to more meticulous and disciplined care than any specific pharmacologic attack on the basic mechanism resulting in ARDS
