## Olfactory Imagery

Imagery that calls upon our sense of smell.

*E.g. The sticky sweet scent of cinamon donuts wafted in the air.*

## Tactile Imagery

Imagery that calls upon our sense of touch.

*E.g. She could still taste the salty sea water on her lips.*

## Gustatory Imagery

Imagery that calls upon our sense of taste.

*E.g. The grass prickled his skin as he lay on the sports ground.*

## Kinesthetic Imagery

Imagery that calls upon our sense of movement.

*E.g. Tripping and stumbling she lurched towards the traitor with her arms outstretched.*
