Adinolfi, 1997-05-28 A Sobolev gradient of a real valued functional is a gradient of that functional taken relative to the underlying Sobolev norm This book shows how descent methods using such gradients allow a unified treatment of a wide variety of problems in differential equations Equal emphasis is placed on numerical and theoretical matters Several concrete applications are made to illustrate the method These applications include 1 Ginzburg Landau functionals of superconductivity 2 problems of transonic flow in which type depends locally on nonlinearities and 3 minimal surface problems Sobolev gradient constructions rely on a study of orthogonal projections onto graphs of closed densely defined linear transformations from one Hilbert space to another These developments use work of Weyl von Neumann and Beurling
