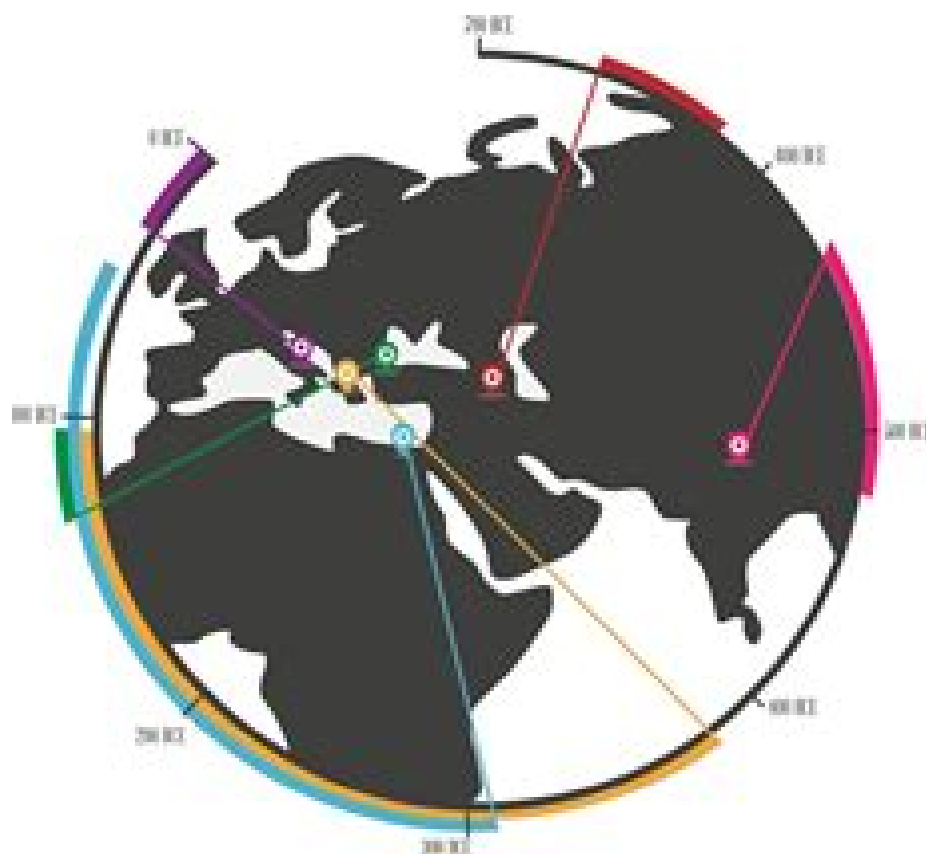

## JETAVANA Buddhist Monastery INDIA

- Associated with Siddhartha Gautama Buddha
- Contained Buddhist, Vedic, and other literature
- Richly furnished, including a reading room and study links

## ARISTOTLES Library GREECE

- Amassed famous collection of books
- Contained at least 400 books
- Collection scattered in different libraries after death

## Libraries of ALEXANDRIA EGYPT

- Contained 400,000-700,000 cataloged and organized scrolls
- Branch library in Syracuse
- Archimedes, Aristophanes, Euclid, and Aristotle among patrons

## PERGAMON Library TURKEY

- Created by Mithras and most likely only open to scholars
- Contained over 200,000 scrolls
- Known for painting and sculpture collection

## Rome's PUBLIC LIBRARY ITALY

- Two reading rooms for Latin and Greek
- Considered first library open to public
- Founded by Gaius Iulius Pollus
