**Gotthard Graubner: Painting** Gotthard Graubner, Heinz Liesbrock, 2010 This publication celebrates the eightieth birthday of German painter Gotthard Graubner born 1930 spanning his work from the 1950s to the present Devoid of figuration or metaphoric allusions the artist's Farbraumkörper or color space bodies evolve entirely out of evanescent color effects somewhat in the vein of Rothko Working on highly absorbent ground Graubner maximizes the murkier tendencies of his pigments      **Gotthard Graubner: Drawings** Erich Franz, Gotthard Graubner, 2011 Gotthard Graubner's drawings in an elementary form embody what his entire artwork his canvas paintings his paintings on paper his graphic prints and his installations define for art They show a becoming a genesis you experience them as a process that leads you to what in them becomes visible Their visuality is not a given it materializes and in its manifestation lies their content The form evolving intensity of the line comes about from its hatched penetration and variation its concentration or disintegration Published in this book is a chronological cross section of his drawings since the end of the 1940s to the present that show how much his works ensue from within and move outwards and in their transition find themselves English and German text      **Gotthard Graubner** ,      Gotthard Graubner. R. Penck In 2016 the New Museum in Nuremberg dedicated an exhibition to Gotthard Graubner entitled Chroma which turned into a festival of color in the wide light flooded exhibition hall The catalog documents the show and presents all 24 Graubner works from the Bockmann Collection in full page images Jürgen Schilling the former director of Villa Massimo in Rome was won as an author He introduces Graubner as an artist who defies all common classifications and with his color space body created a tailor made instrument for his chromatic expeditions      **Visual proficiency - A perspective on art education** Kunibert
