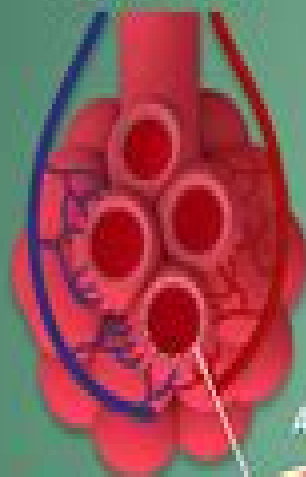


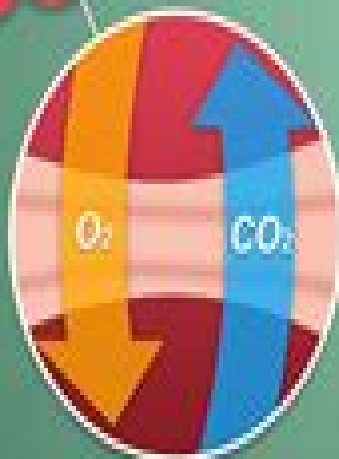

Normal alveoli



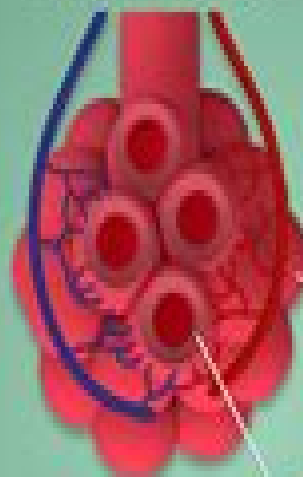
Alveoli

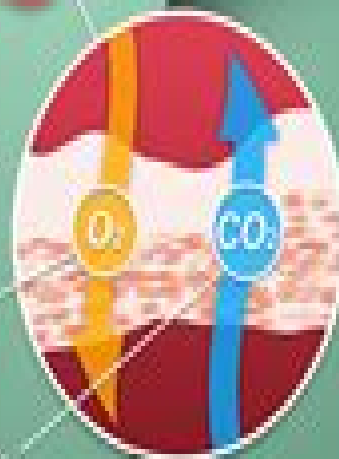

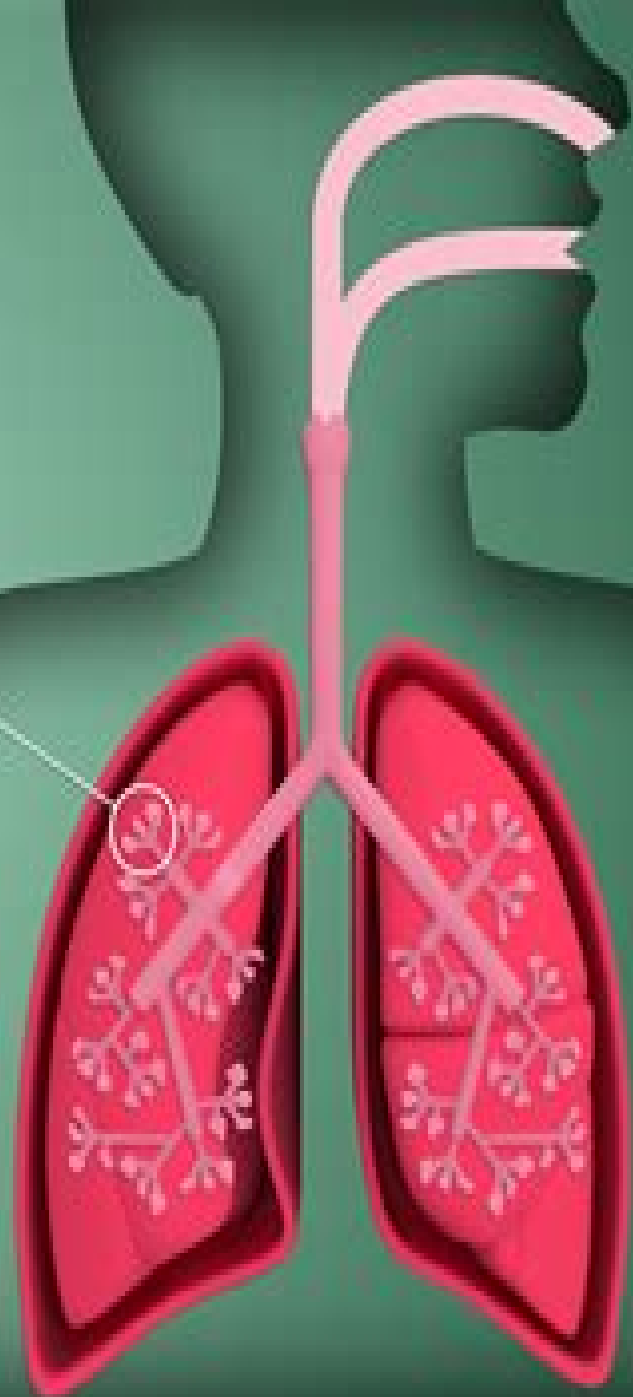
