**Encounters with Verdi** Marcello Conati, 1986 An anthology of reminiscences interviews memoirs and essays by a wide ranging group of people journalists musicians impresarios or chance acquaintances who met the reclusive and secretive composer at various moments during his long life Each entry has a relevant place within the chronology of Verdi's life and every reference to an unfamiliar event or name in the text is explained in the copious footnotes *Interviews and Encounters with Verdi* Marcello Conati, 1984-01-01 Verzameling documenten van en over de Italiaanse componist 1813-1901 voorafgegaan door uitgebreide commentaren *Not without Madness* Fabrizio Della Seta, 2012-11-22 Opera often seems to arouse either irrational enthusiasm or visceral dislike Such madness as Goethe wrote is indispensable in all theater and yet in practice sentiment and passion must be balanced by sense and reason Exploring this tension between madness and reason *Not without Madness* presents new analytical approaches to thinking about eighteenth and nineteenth century opera through the lenses of its historical and cultural contexts In these twelve essays Fabrizio Della Seta explores the concept of opera as a dramatic event and an essential moment in the history of theater Examining the meaning of opera and the devices that produce and transmit this meaning he looks at the complex verbal musical and scenic mechanisms in parts of *La sonnambula* *Ernani* *Aida* *Le nozze di Figaro* *Macbeth* and *Il trovatore* He argues that approaches to the study of opera must address performance interpretation composition reception and cultural ramifications Purely musical analysis does not make sense unless we take into account music's dramatic function Containing many essays available for the first time in English *Not without Madness* bridges recent divisions in opera studies and will attract musicologists musicians and opera lovers alike

*The Birth of an Opera: Fifteen Masterpieces from Poppea to Wozzeck* Michael Rose, 2013-03-18 *The Birth of an Opera* offers illuminating insight into how operas are written and the personalities incidents and musical circumstances that have shaped their composition Through a deft compilation of primary sources letters memoirs and personal accounts from composers librettists and performers Michael Rose re-creates for his readers the circumstances that gave rise to fifteen operatic milestones From Monteverdi and Mozart to Puccini and Berg each chapter focuses on a well-known opera and tells the story that lies behind its creation Rather than retreading familiar ground with pages of historical and musical analysis Rose places each opera firmly in the context of the composer's life and provides an engaging text in which the varied and colorful personalities involved are seen to discuss comment and contribute in one way or another to the progress of its composition The reader will find Mozart with a new and flamboyant librettist tackling the risky enterprise of *Le Nozze di Figaro* Wagner confessing his hidden love for the woman who inspires him as he creates the passionate drama of *Tristan und Isolde* Verdi deep in Shakespearean discussion with Boito as they remodel the tragedy of *Otello* and Debussy coming almost literally to blows with Maeterlinck over the soprano to take the leading role in *Pell as et M lisande* Throughout Rose offers his readers the most direct possible link to events that have often become twisted or obscured by operatic myth and in so

doing he captures the bizarre interactions of chance genius practical necessity and dogged determination that accompanied the making of some of opera's most enduring masterpieces
