ultimately achieving the shame free presentation of self Picucci says he offers nothing less than a re birthing process through a combination of one on one psychotherapy support groups and spirituality His own life experiences as a gay man once married now HIV positive surviving AIDS cancer a heart attack triple bypass surgery and drug and alcohol addictions give him a uniquely credible perspective on healing and wholeness In his cogent well organized handbook Picucci functions a bit like the gay shamans who had a special place in North American Indian tribes His compassionate acceptance of diversity will inspire many readers to care to take the next step and seek the help they need
