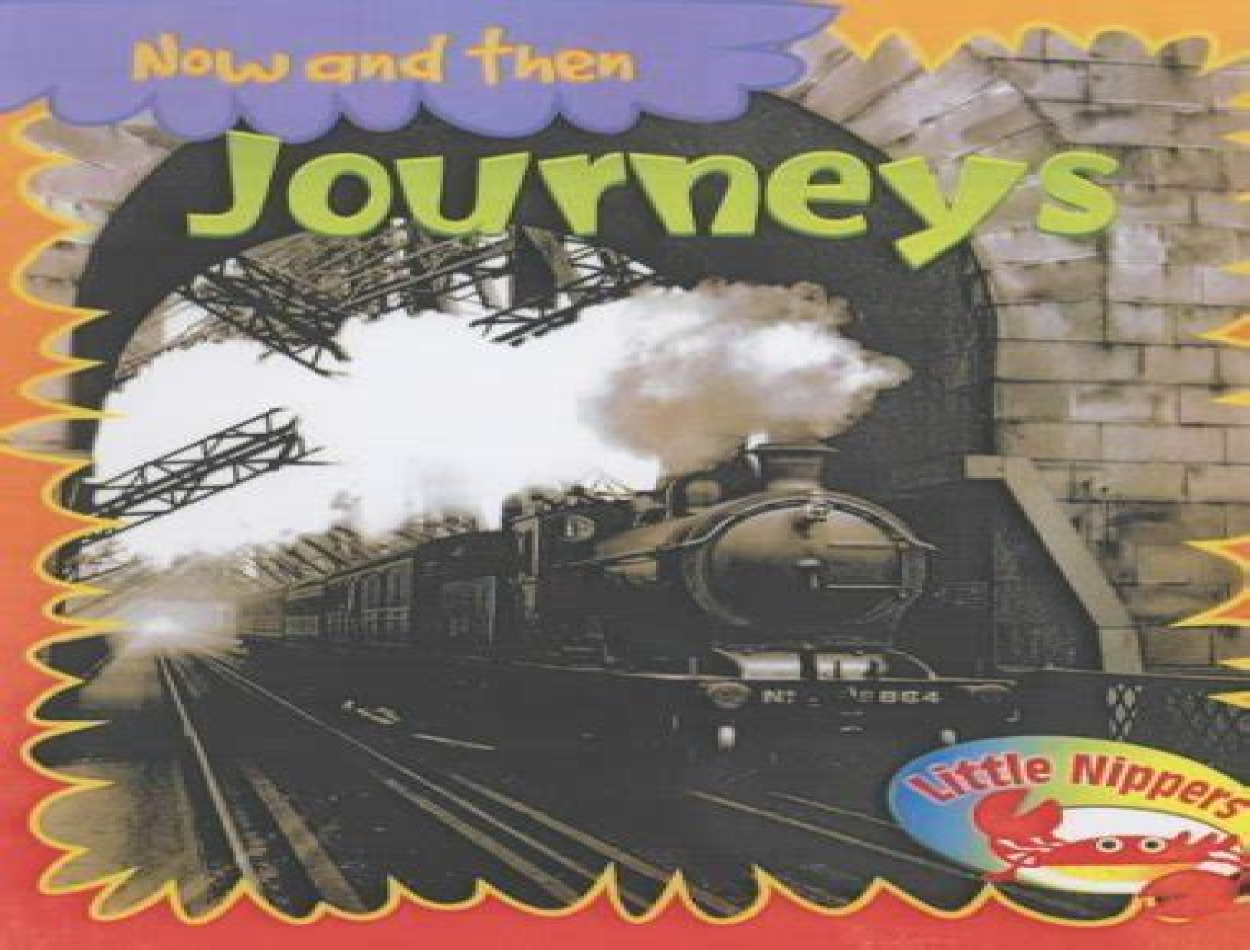

exploration of human character Zola's prose invites readers to not only observe but to engage with the moral complexities of his time making it an essential addition to the canon of classic literature **Rome** Émile Zola, 1897 Three Cities Trilogy: Lourdes, Rome & Paris Emile Zola, 2017-10-06 In this trilogy translated by Ernest Alfred Vizetelly 1853 1922 Zola delves into the history and politics of the Catholic church The protagonist of all three novels is Abb Pierre Froment In Lourdes Pierre seemed in danger of losing his faith but Rome opens with the young priest experiencing a newfound fervor toward his calling Lourdes Lourdes originally published in 1894 is the first volume in Emile Zola's Three Cities Trilogy Zola examines the phenomena of the Lourdes shrine in southern France and the pilgrims who go there Based on his own trip to the fabled grotto the novel follows a simple five part structure corresponding to the five day train trip from Paris to Lourdes and back Rome Originally published in 1896 Rome is the second volume in the Three Cities Trilogy The story takes place in the late 19th century shortly after Italy has gained its independence and absorbed the former Papal States Zola repeatedly contrasts

the former glory of Imperial Rome with the city's present state of financial ruin and decay. The populace of Rome is split between two factions: the black and the white, those faithful to the Vatican and those loyal to the new Italian government. The church in turn is divided among those who adamantly cling to time-honored dogma and those who think the church must make concessions and broaden its appeal in order to survive in the modern world. Paris: Paris is the third volume of the Three Cities trilogy. Published in 1898, Paris is Zola's summation of the 19th Century and his predictions and hopes for the 20th Century. In this work, Zola gives a splendid portrayal of social life in Paris at the end of the century. He takes us into the lives of men and women of the upper classes, the working class, and even revolutionary Anarchists.

**The Three Cities: Lourdes, Rome and Paris** Émile Zola, 2016-08-25. BEFORE perusing this work, it is as well that the reader should understand M. Zola's aim in writing it and his views as distinct from those of his characters. Upon Lourdes, its Grotto, and its cures. A short time before the book appeared, M. Zola was interviewed upon the subject by his friend and biographer Mr. Robert H. Sherard, to whom he spoke as follows: Lourdes came to be written by mere accident. In 1891 I happened to be travelling for my pleasure with my wife in the Basque country and by the Pyrenees, and being in the neighbourhood of Lourdes included it in my tour. I spent fifteen days there and was greatly struck by what I saw, and it then occurred to me that there was material here for just the sort of novel that I like to write: a novel in which great masses of men can be shown in motion, un grand mouvement de foule, a novel the subject of which stirred up my philosophical ideas. It was too late then to study the question, for I had visited Lourdes late in September and so had missed seeing the best pilgrimage which takes place in August, under the direction of the Pères de la Miséricorde of the Rue de l'Assomption in Paris, the National Pilgrimage, as it is called. These Fathers are very active enterprising men and have made a great success of this annual national pilgrimage. Under their direction thirty thousand pilgrims are transported to Lourdes, including over a thousand sick persons. So in the following year I went in August and saw a national pilgrimage and followed it during the three days which it lasts, in addition to the two days given to travelling. After its departure I stayed on ten or twelve days working up the subject in every detail. My book is the story of such a national pilgrimage and is accordingly the story of five days. It is divided into five parts, each of which is limited to one day.

**The Three Cities Trilogy: Rome** Émile Zola, 2016-01-31. Rome is the second book of a trilogy that started with Lourdes and concludes with Paris. Often called the Three Cities trilogy. In Rome the story depicts a disillusioned priest as he goes to the Vatican to defend his book, which is to be placed on the Index of Prohibited Books. The story explores his hope for a new kind of Christianity that, in his opinion, will meet the needs of modern society in a better way. He is confronted with a religious organisation unable to change with the times. Zola's critical description of Papal bureaucracy will not endear this work to devout Catholics, but his description of the inner workings of the Vatican is informative and fascinating.
