internal medicine and acute geriatric medicine is becoming more blurred. It is nevertheless apparent that some elderly patients on medical or subspecialty hospital wards become bed blockers. Why? Also, why are bed blockers less of a problem on an acute geriatric ward? Many clinicians believe this is related to a faster access to the long stay beds of the geriatric unit. Even a brief study of hospital operating statistics will show this is not and cannot be the case. When geriatricians are asked to see elderly bed blockers on colleagues' wards, they approach with anxiety because these patients often have to be placed on a long waiting list for these scarce and very expensive continuing care beds.
