If your child shows these red flags, or you are concerned about other aspects of your child's speech and language development, contact a speech-language pathologist.

### 4 YEARS

- Uses only 3-word phrases
- Speech is not understandable to parents
- Takes a long time to understand others
- Difficulty asking questions and finding words to express thoughts

### 5 YEARS

- Speaks only simple sentences
- Speech is not understandable to teachers
- Difficulty answering questions
- Difficulty with complex directions
- Difficulty telling stories
- Difficulty with peer interactions

### SCHOOL AGE

- Difficulty with reading, writing, or math
- Difficulty following directions or repeating sentences
- Uses sentences with grammar errors, limited vocabulary
- Difficulty with social interactions
