**Metaphysics**  
The study of the nature of reality

**According To:**

**Epistemology**  
The study of being

**Aristotle**  
That which perceives takes on a sensible form (without matter) so in thinking, that which thinks takes on an intelligible form (without matter).



**Ontology**  
What exists in the human world that we can acquire knowledge about

**Constructionism**  
Meaning created from the interplay between the subject & object; subject constructs the reality of object

**Subjectivism**  
Meaning exists within the subject; subject imposes meaning on an object

**Empiricism**  
All knowledge is based on experience derived from the senses

**Objectivism**  
Meaning exists within an object; an objective reality exists in an object independent of the subject

**Relativism**  
Multiple realities exist

**Bounded Relativism**  
Physical constructions of reality are equal in space and time within boundaries; no reality beyond subjects

**Relativism**  
Reality exists as multiple, intangible mental constructions; no reality beyond subjects

**Realism**  
One reality exists

**Naïve Realism**  
Reality can be understood using appropriate methods

**Structural Realism**  
Reality is described by a scientific theory, but its underlying nature remains uncertain

**Critical Realism**  
Reality captured by broad critical examination

**Philosophical Perspectives**  
Generalized views of the world, which form beliefs that guide action.

Generalized views of the world form beliefs that guide action. People usually think according to their inclinations, speak according to their learning and ingrained opinions, but generally act according to custom.



**To Predict**  
Knowledge acquisition is deductive, value-free, and generalisable

**Positivism**  
An approach to the study of society that relies specifically on scientific methods, such as measurement and statistics

**Post-Positivism**  
Multiple methods are necessary to identify a valid truth because all methods are imperfect

**Hermeneutics**  
Hidden meaning for religious texts, traditions, events, and other apparent ones

**Phenomenology**  
The essence of human experience or phenomena is only understood when the researcher separates their own preconceptions from the phenomena

**Interpretivism**  
Natural science methods cannot apply to social science; interpretations of reality are culturally derived & historically

**Constructivism**  
Meaning making of reality is an active process of the individual mind

**Critical Theory**  
Research & theory should be used to change situations; critiques on power relations, ideologies, inequalities & systems

**Post-Structuralism**  
Discourses divide the world and give it meaning

**Post-Modernism**  
Truth claims are constructed to serve the interests of particular groups; methods are equally constructed; it might not be possible to arrive at any conclusions of reality

**Pragmatism**  
An approach that evaluates theories or methods in terms of the success of their practical application

**Michel Foucault**

His concept of discourses are a set of ideas and practices with particular conditions of existence, which are more or less institutionalised, but which may only be partially understood by those that they encompass. As a discourse fixes text with a specific meaning, it disqualifies other meanings and interpretations.



**John Locke**

Thinking on its own is not enough. Locke believed that knowledge was founded on empirical observation and experience. There are no innate ideas that are with us when we are born. At birth, we are a blank slate.



**George Berkeley**

There are no material substances. There are only finite mental substances and an infinite mental substance, namely, God. Berkeley's immaterialism argues that to be is to be perceived (or to perceive). That is saying only what perceived or perceives is real, and without our perception or God's nothing can be real.



**David Hume**

Hume believed causes and effects are discoverable not by reason but by experience. Even with the perspective of the past, humanity cannot dictate future events because thoughts of the past are limited compared to the possibilities for the future.
