The High Risk Patient: Management of the Critically Ill is another sizeable book devoted to intensive care medicine. The editors are assisted by 126 contributors. There are 10 sections, 42 chapters, and rich bibliography and suggested reading lists. Many of the authors went to great lengths searching the literature to demonstrate creative efforts to manage patients when conventional methods fail. The tables, figures, and reproductions of radiographs are numerous. Indeed, the color plates are extremely well done, and they address the issues at hand as described by the authors.

Many of the chapters are multiaxial from a written perspective, as well as from an information perspective. Three chapters cover neuromuscular disorders, preoperative head and neck surgery, upper airway management. Hypertensive emergencies, oncological emergencies, disorders of hepatic function, liver transplant, and AIDS. Other sections include management and quality assurance issues, and a spectacular

chapter was devoted to imaging techniques in the ICU. A successful table is included in this latter chapter on the common clinical conditions encountered in the ICU, with suggestions for primary and secondary imaging modalities. Another very strong chapter is devoted to studies that predict patient outcome (i.e., TISS, APACHE, MPD). The section on the bereavement is probably the most thorough, in any available critical care text.

A certain degree of redundancy is found in many of the chapters, acknowledging the size of the text and the material covered. Use of a pre-ICU phase, an ICU phase, and a post-ICU phase model of explaining diseases within each chapter is also occasionally confusing. Inclusion of a chapter on minimizing the risk of liability near the end of the text registers a sour note in this reviewer's opinion. Finally, a future edition should include more information on long-term life support and failure. Patient examples would be appreciated.

Helping this book approaches management of critically ill patients in a unique fashion by identifying high-risk conditions. It is valuable to all physicians involved in the care of seriously ill patients. Accordingly, the text is a welcomed addition to the critical care medicine library. Although I would like to see its cost reduced, I believe the quality of print, the reproductions, and the color plates justify its price.
