Ruwet, 2012-12-06 The present volume is intended to give an overall picture of research in progress in the field of generative grammar in various parts of Europe The term generative grammar must however be understood here rather broadly What seemed to be an easily definable technical term several years ago is becoming more and more vague and imprecise Research in generative grammar is carried on according to rather diversified methodological principles and being a generative grammarian is often more a matter of confession than any adherence to the common line of methodology which can be traced back to the conception of grammatical description initiated by Noam Chomsky The direct or indirect influence of this conception is however clearly recognizable in most of the papers of this volume The most difficult thing was naturally enough to select appropriate papers in the realm of semantics Apart from the special trend in generative grammar referred to as generative semantics though here too we might ponder on what generative really means the term generative is hardly employed in semantics The search for semantic primes the application of the methods of mathematical logic the inquiry into the intricate relationships between syntax and semantics and the utilization of syntactic information in semantics are perhaps the most characteristic traits of contemporary semantics All of this of course is at no variance with the principles of generative grammar on the contrary most of it has been made possible through the achievements of generative grammar

rules and transformations in order to explain the variation between these structures As a result focus has been put on purely structural aspects while conceptual differences have been highly neglected The present book challenges this view of linguistic analysis Instead of proposing a general semantic content for finite and infinitive adverbial clauses in Portuguese traditionally based on notions like deep structure and surface structure the hypothesis put forward is that these clauses evoke different meanings and that the use of one adverbial structure or another can be explained by the context in which it occurs and by the conceptual content it designates From a Cognitive Grammar perspective of linguistic analysis it is shown that Portuguese adverbial structures illustrate the iconic nature of language and that their conceptual meaning can be explained by notions such as prominence mental spaces control and subjectification

Foundations of Language, 1973 **Prosody and Focus in European Portuguese** Sonia Frota, 2014-01-21 This work is an investigation of the relation between prosodic structure intonational structure and some instances of focus realisation in European Portuguese EP The prosodic account has been developed within the relation-based framework of prosodic hierarchy theory and the autosegmental metrical theory of intonational phonology The approach is both theoretical and laboratory phonology research Based on the analysis of various types of evidence i.e. Gandhi processes rhythmic intentional and boundary strength phenomena issues such as prosodic layering and the effect of branchingness and phrase length on prosodic phrasing are discussed Specifically I recursion in the form of restricted Compound Prosodic Domains is argued for Moreover the fact that the diverse manifestations of prosodic structure point to the same hierarchical organization of the flow of speech into F's and I's crucially assigns to the prosodic hierarchy a pivotal place in phrasal phonology Attention is paid furthermore to aspects of intonational structure like tonal association and alignment the characterization of leading and trailing tones and pitch accents structure It is argued that the HL accents of EP are real bitonal events whose features favour
