Section 6 deals with adolescent concerns, including life skills training, relationships, and sexuality. Section 7 focuses on residential, vocational, and family-related challenges of adulthood and aging. Section 8 deals with professional issues and risk assessment. Chapters cover theoretical and empirical issues on the one hand and practice issues on the other. They close with summaries and suggestions for further reading for practitioners and families containing a member with an intellectual disability. Where appropriate, in many chapters, practice exercises to aid skills development have been included.
