faced by such countries as Bulgaria, Israel, Malaysia and in a slightly different way facing not religious diversity but ethnic difference Turkey. The case of Cyprus by contrast is one of a country actually split along lines of ethno religious difference. Additional studies of the connection between religious education and the terms of citizenship in the EU, France and the USA provide important contrasts to the challenges facing us as we seek to educate our citizenry in an age of religious resurgence and global politics.
