G E Moore wrote Principia Ethica 1903 in which he accused Aquinas of committing the naturalistic fallacy by deriving an 'ought' from an 'is'. Simply, he took a fact, such as sex 'is' a function of reproduction and claimed that people 'ought' only use it with knowing intention of creating new life. Lytton Strachey followed this criticism with "...that indiscriminate heap of shattered rubbish among which one spies the mangled remains of Aristotle, Jesus, Kant, Aquinas and Spencer. Plato seems to have come out tolerably well". That is how the accusation of natural fallacy has left these theories.
