Instability in the Middle East Karel Černý, 2017-07-01 Middle Eastern instability is manifest externally in many ways by crises afflicting governing regimes, the rise of political Islam, terrorism, revolution, civil war, increased migration and the collapse of many states. This book examines the roots of this instability using a theoretically original and empirically supported historical sociological comparative analysis. Up till now interpretations of the development of the post-colonial Middle East have been dominated by two opposing theses. The first views the region as backward, unchanging and rigid; the second as undergoing excessively rapid transformation. This book offers an alternative perspective focusing on the highly uneven and unsynchronised pace of change in individual dimensions of Middle Eastern modernisation. What we are seeing is: 1) rapid socio-demographic change, a sharp increase in the population and the proportion of young people, rapid urbanisation and the expansion of the media and education; 2) slower and unstable economic change, dependency on oil exports, high unemployment; and 3) slow or regressive political change, erosion of the capacity to govern, the absence of democratisation and liberalisation. The theoretical model employed emerged from a critical reading of theories of modernisation and a concept of multiple modernities that also allows for an interrogation of the broader cultural, religious and international political context of uneven modernisation in the Middle East. This model is then tested empirically using the time series 1960-2010 of dozens of indicators covering the demographic, social, economic and political dimensions of the modernisation process. In general, the book does not concentrate on externally monitorable political actors and their rivalries, as so often is the case. Instead, it focuses on the political rivalries of deep, long-term, cumulative demographic, social and economic change taking place beneath the surface. It looks at changes that are not simply taking place in individual countries of the Middle East but since the end of the Second World War have affected the entire region and are responsible for the emergence of a Middle East completely different to that to which we were accustomed for many decades.

Central Asia and Regional Security Mr P L Dash, Ms Anita Sengupta, Mr Murat M Bakhadirov, 2014-02-15 While security concerns have assumed salience across the globe, Afghanistan's proximity to Central Asia has meant that security or perceptions of insecurity dominate the strategic discourse in the region. Alexis Keller, 2006-01-26 Just War has attracted considerable attention The words peace and justice are often used together Surprisingly however little conceptual thinking has gone into what constitutes a Just Peace This book which includes some of the world's leading scholars debates and develops the concept of Just Peace The problem with the idea of a Just Peace is that striving for justice may imply a Just War In other words peace and justice clash at times Therefore one often starts from a given view of what constitutes justice but this a priori approach leads especially when imposed from the outside straight into discord This book presents conflicting viewpoints on this question from political historical and legal perspectives as well as from a policy perspective The book also argues that Just Peace should be defined as a process resting on four necessary and sufficient conditions thin recognition whereby the other is accepted as autonomous thick recognition whereby identities need to be accounted for renouncement requiring significant sacrifices from all parties and finally rule the objectification of a Just Peace by a text requiring a common language respecting the identities of each and defining their rights and duties This approach based on a language oriented process amongst directly concerned parties goes beyond liberal and culturalist perspectives Throughout the process negotiators need to build a novel shared reality as well as a new common language allowing for an enduring harmony between previously clashing peoples It challenges a liberal view of peace founded on norms claiming universal scope The liberal conception has difficulty in solving conflicts such as civil wars characterized typically by fundamental disagreements between different communities Cultures make demands that are identity defining and some of these defy the cultural neutrality that is one of the foundations of liberalism Therefore the concept of Just Peace cannot be solved within the liberal tradition
