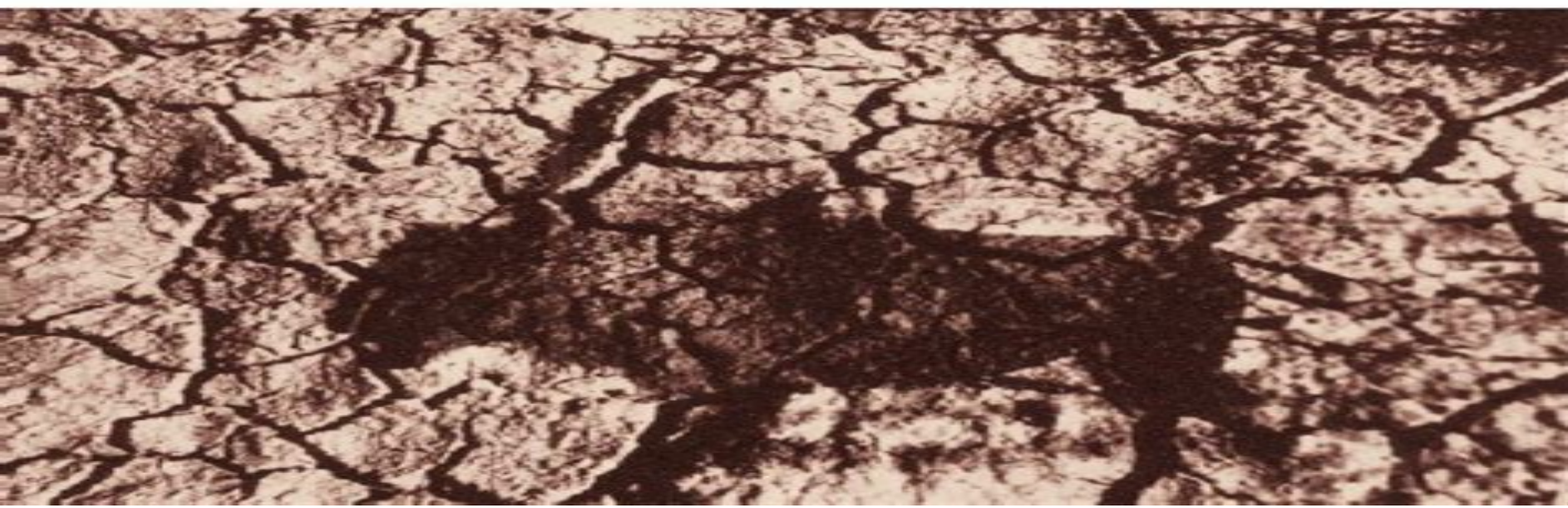

presents three Raven stories that were adapted as stage plays from oral versions told in Tlingit by three storytellers of her community These plays were commissioned by the Naa Kahidi Theater and have been performed throughout America and Europe They take the form of a storyteller delivering a narrative while other members of the cast act and dance in masks and costumes Collectively Dauenhauer's writings form an autoethnography offering new insight into how the Tlingit have been affected by modernization and how Native American culture perseveres in the face of change Despite the hardships her people have seen this woman affirms the goodness of life as found in family and community in daily work and play and in tribal traditions
