almost 50 years after the rush in California it drew tens of thousands of prospectors despite the unforgiving climate Mineral resources had gone a long way in the United States acquiring Alaska a generation earlier but the lack of transportation kept all but the most dedicated from venturing into the Yukon and Alaska until the announcement of the gold rush For a few years the attention turned to the Northwest and thanks to vivid descriptions by writers like Jack London the nation became intrigued with the idea of miners toughing out the winter conditions to find hidden gold Of course despite the mythology and the romantic portrayals that helped make the Klondike Gold Rush most of the individuals who came to make a fortune struck out instead
