and has set out a number of key priorities including that the delivery process of the National Curriculum tests should be modernised and improved in consultation with the marking community including piloting online marking that whatever process is used should be thoroughly piloted and project managed to ensure schools and pupils get their results on time that the customer service provided to markers must be vastly improved to ensure that they are properly supported and are able to access up to date information
