children's working memory Klingberg also discusses how stress can impair working memory skydivers tested just before a jump showed a 30% drop in working memory and how aerobic exercise can actually modify the brain's nerve cells and improve classroom performance Torkel Klingberg is one of the world's leading cognitive neuroscientists but in this book he wears his erudition lightly writing with simplicity and good humor as he shows us how to give our children the best chance to learn and grow
