Stage	Approx. age	Characterized by
Prelinguistic stage	Birth-6 mos	Cries, gurgles, and coos to express needs and feelings
Babbling stage	6-12 mos	Strings of consonant-vowel combinations, such as "bababa"
Holophrastic (single-word) stage	12-18 mos	Use of a single word to convey a complete idea or message
Two-word stage	18-24 mos	Two-word combinations forming simple sentences that show some grammar awareness
Telegraphic speech stage	24-36 mos	Short sentences that omit non-essential words but still convey complete ideas
Complex sentence stage	36+ mos	Sentences with multiple clauses that express more complicated ideas and can be easily understood
