

Definition of a Limit

Formal Definition (ϵ - δ Definition): The limit of a function $f(x)$ as x approaches a value c is L if, for every $\epsilon > 0$, there exists a $\delta > 0$

Formula:
$$\lim_{x \rightarrow c} f(x) = L$$

Intuitive Understanding: The limit $\lim_{x \rightarrow c} f(x) = L$ means that as x gets closer and closer to c , the function value $f(x)$ gets closer and closer to L .

One-Sided Limits: Left-hand limit:
 $\lim_{x \rightarrow c^-} f(x) = L$, where x approaches c from the left (i.e., $x < c$).

Right-hand limit: $\lim_{x \rightarrow c^+} f(x) = L$, where x approaches c from the right (i.e., $x > c$).

Limits at Infinity: As x approaches infinity:
 $\lim_{x \rightarrow \infty} f(x) = L$ means that as x becomes very large.

As x approaches negative infinity: $\lim_{x \rightarrow -\infty} f(x) = L$
