Following children are at high risk for long term health problems:

- Neonatal CNS infections (meningitis, encephalitis).
- Infants requiring major surgery (brain, cardiac, abdominal, thoracic).
- Hyperbilirubinemia (bilirubin encephalopathy)
- Neurobehavioral abnormalities noted in the newborn period
- Substance abuse by either parents
- Major psychiatric history in either parent
- Developmental disability in either parent.
