boom which made music readily available through radio and the phonograph record created an even larger audience for the new music But Ogren maintains that jazz itself through its syncopated beat improvisation and blue tonalities spoke to millions Based on print media secondary sources biographies and autobiographies and making extensive use of oral histories The Jazz Revolution offers provocative insights into both early jazz and American culture Jazz and Justice Gerald Horne, 2019-06-18 A galvanizing history of how jazz and jazz musicians flourished despite rampant cultural exploitation.
