

of courtroom talk is radically *not* like making sense out of other forms of talk. This aspect of reconstructing reality in the courtroom is ignored in an analysis that emphasizes similarities between talk in court and stories.

I agree with the authors that it is important to point out that somewhat different kinds of activities may involve similar social processes. But relating trials to stories in particular accomplishes no clear end and ignores and obscures the very important ways in which interpretative processes in courtrooms are significantly different from those in other settings within our society.

This book raises several key questions about whether or not there has come "a time of sufficient maturation of linguistic science to allow its practitioners access to problems of communication in key human institutions with a reasonable expectation of substantive results, either as clarifications or solutions" (xi).

For several decades, the primary target of applied linguistics has been language teaching — both foreign language instruction and, more recently, the teaching of standard English speaking, reading, and writing. Although leading linguists have at times made programmatic statements about the broad scope of activities possible for applied linguists, the bulk of work has been in language teaching. The Center for Applied Linguistics was established in the 1950s at a time when linguists in the United States saw themselves as making major contributions to the teaching of foreign languages and English as a second language, and the preparation of language textbooks and tests. In the late 1960s and early 1970s, basic sociolinguistic research in black urban communities was interpreted both by linguists and educators for application to the teaching of standard English.

Yet the effects of these and other applications of basic linguistic research are difficult to demonstrate. Though more research on foreign language teaching has been done in the United States than in any other nation, those educated in U.S. schools are widely known as the world's poorest second language learners. The role of black dialect studies in improving reading/language arts instruction and hence possibly raising the academic achievement of minority students is far from clear. Some linguists have argued that internal institutional changes must occur before basic research applications can take hold. Others have maintained that the attitudes of Americans toward their language is such that social science research will not change underlying beliefs and values that affect English usage and generally negative valuations of languages other than English.
